Cross-Border CHEMPACK Exercise


Partnered with Nevada County to practice out-of-state transport in the event of a chemical emergency.



Evaluated strengths and improvement areas by provider type in Washoe County, with potential as a national assessment model.


Average Number of Organizations by Provider Type that Completed at Least One Assessment

FY25 HVA

The top 10 hazards as identified through the coalition's FY25 HVA are as follows:

- Cybersecurity – 30%
- Fire, External- 30%
- Earthquake- 30%
- Temperature Extremes- 27%
- Supply Chain Shortage/Failure- 27%
- Workplace Violence/Threat – 26%
- Severe Storms – 25%
- Extreme Weather- 25%
- Weapon – 25%
- Power Outage, Unplanned -24%
