- Prior to purchase, dealer must assist buyer in determining eligibility of the property to have a wood-burning device or an additional low-emitting device per AQMD regulations

IMPORTANT: A building permit is required for wood-burning device installation in Reno, Sparks or Washoe County. **This form must be signed off by AQMD before a building permit can be issued.**
